HCAM's Behavioral Health Outreach Programs connect clients to a full range of supports and treatments that promote their overall health, wellness, and recovery. Read about our major activities below.

Baltimore Buprenorphine Initiative

HCAM collaborates with the Baltimore City Health Department and Behavioral Health System Baltimore to link substance use treatment providers, community health centers, and primary care physicians in the fight to end heroin and prescription drug addiction in Baltimore.

Care Coordination for Women and Children

HCAM offers care coordination services to women who are in treatment for substance use disorder, have at least one child in their custody, and are enrolled into the Women and Children Supportive Housing Project by Behavioral Health System Baltimore.

Information and Referral Line

In partnership with Behavioral Health System Baltimore and Baltimore Crisis Response, Inc., we provide Baltimore City residents 24/7 access to behavioral health information and referral assistance. Certified Addiction Counselors and Mental Health Specialists link callers to their optimal level of care, facilitate appointments, and follow up to ensure the client gets connected.

Eviction Prevention and Rapid Rehousing

HCAM provides security deposits and rental assistance to individuals who are homeless or who are at risk of being evicted and becoming homeless.

Homeless Outreach Services

In collaboration with the Mayor's Office of Human Services and the Journey Home, our advocates engage with homeless individuals and families to provide them with resources for housing, health insurance, primary care and behavioral health treatment, identification documents, and more.

Jurisdictional/State Care Coordination

This program helps residents in Anne Arundel County, Baltimore City, and Baltimore County overcome the challenges that can prevent them from moving successfully through all phases of recovery. Clients are referred to our programs from residential or outpatient substance abuse treatment providers.

Maryland RecoveryNet

HCAM connects Maryland residents to services that promote their independence, self-sufficiency, and stability, encouraging their completion of treatment for substance use disorder.
